DIRECTORS MESSAGE

As this message is being written we start to see the weather change. warmer days provide us opportunities to get out and inspect any damage to the "antenna farm" that may have occurred over the Winter months. Be sure to check all ropes (polypropylene deteriorates in sun light), it is far easier to replace an existing rope than to place a new one! Be sure to check all fasteners especially where water could concentrate, where possible it is good practice to leave fasteners exposed, water has been known to collect in taped areas creating rust and weakening the fastener. Next should be a physical inspect of your coax lines and any control cables to insure you have not been visited by any rodents and all connections are still water tight. A little prevention may save a more costly or inopportune failure!

There are a couple of club activities approaching and we would like to get some indication on who will be attending. The Fox hunt is scheduled for June 8th and Field Day is June 22-23. We would like to know who is thinking of coming out to the two events, please let us know.
