One of the enjoyable aspects of a hamfest is that you don't know what you'll find or who you will meet. Speaking of club events, at the September meeting it was proposed that a workshop of some type be created, and following further discussion, an Arduino-oriented workshop. Our vice-president, **Paul VA3LX** will be heading this event which should take place sometime in October. You can BYOA (Bring Your Own Arduino) or just come to learn and see it in action.

If you don't have an Arduino but would like to get one, you can purchase an Arduino Uno for about \$30, and there are many cheap Chinese clones of the Arduino available as well. I recommend buying the genuine article if this is your first go at microcontrollers, as it is well documented and comes with a USB interface and other features to make getting started easy. The clones can be had for as little as \$3 shipped but often skimp on extra features and may require an external programmer, serial-USB interface, headers and other things that a new user may find helpful.
